“An Historical Miracle - The Sovereign Order of the  
Orthodox Knights Hospitaller of St. John of Jerusalem”**

Countess Bobrinsky, Tatiana de Timasheff, comes from a distinguished family of archaic hereditary nobility. Legend says they were Boyards under Ivan the Terrible and descendants of Genghis Khan. They were marshals of nobility of the provinces of Astrahan and Orenburg. Her father was the eminent Dr. Nicholas S. Timasheff, theoretical jurist and sociologist, a Professor at Harvard University, and co-founding father of the discipline known as Sociology of Law. Count Nicholas Bobrinsky — Tatiana's late husband — headed the current Order of St. John, which was established in New York by Russian nobility and remained under the protection of Prince Andrew, a double Romanoff. Countess Bobrinsky is now the Grande Dame of the Sovereign Order and during the past year has organized the first meeting commemorating the 200th Anniversary of the American-Russian treaty/alliance which was signed by Thomas Jefferson and Emperor Alexander I. The Countess is currently developing priorities in Denmark, Hungary, Serbia, Norway and Germany.
